## **Program 1** **Making It Better**

*Bully/Conflict Resolution Through Experiential Non-Violent Collaborative Problem Solving*  
Non-violent conflict resolution, anti-bullying, and leadership

skills are critical in a dangerous, crowded world. *Making It Better* teaches these skills to your students in a fun way.

## **Program 2** **Global Perspectives**

*"Perspective is more important than IQ."*

Using a giant map of the world, this program brings a global perspective to your classroom. Fun, interactive, learning filled.

## **Program 3** **World PeaceGame**

*Bringing Peace to the World, One Game at a Time*  
This interactive, experiential and fun activity puts your class, school, or organization in charge of bringing peace to the

world. It provides a framework for understanding the world and creating a culture of peace. Players learn about the complexities of conflict, the costs of war, the price of peace, and what can be done to resolve conflicts in ways that bring peace to the world.

## **Program 4** **Pacem Leadership Game**

The youth of the world have consistently changed the world for the better. *Now it is your student's turn.* This program develops leadership skills while providing a global perspective.

## **Program 5** **Climate ChangeGame**

You are put in charge of the global climate in this fast-paced multimedia simulation. It's an epic, multidimensional race between the rising temperature of the Earth, human greenhouse gas emissions, and climate change abatement activities

## **Program 6** **Global Solutions Lab**
