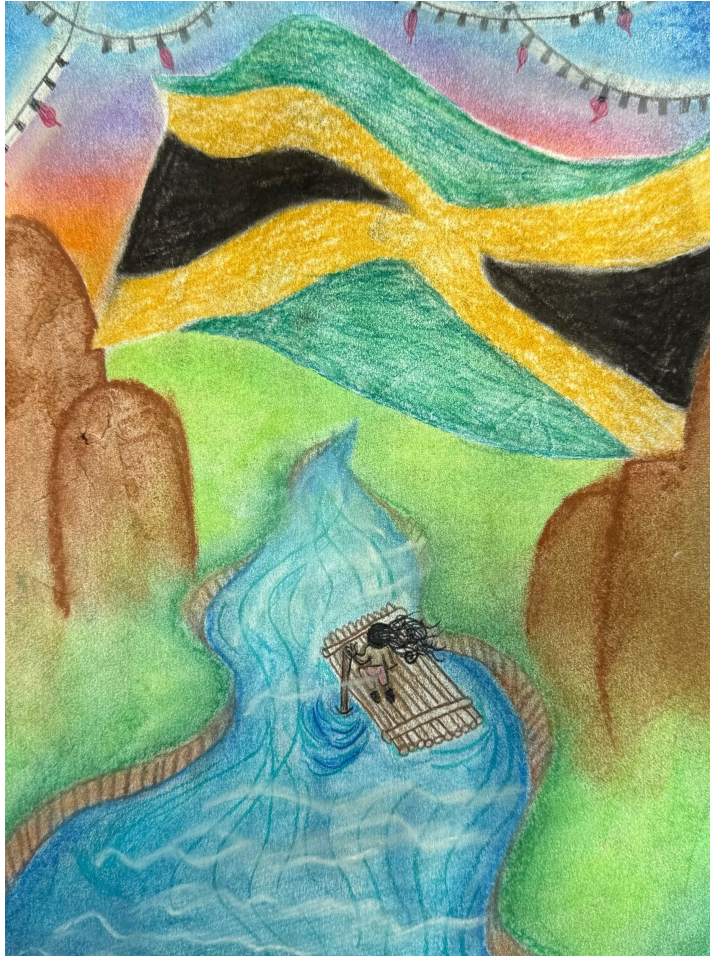
Artist Statement: I think that a farm is a peaceful world because I love horses, ponies, and corn.

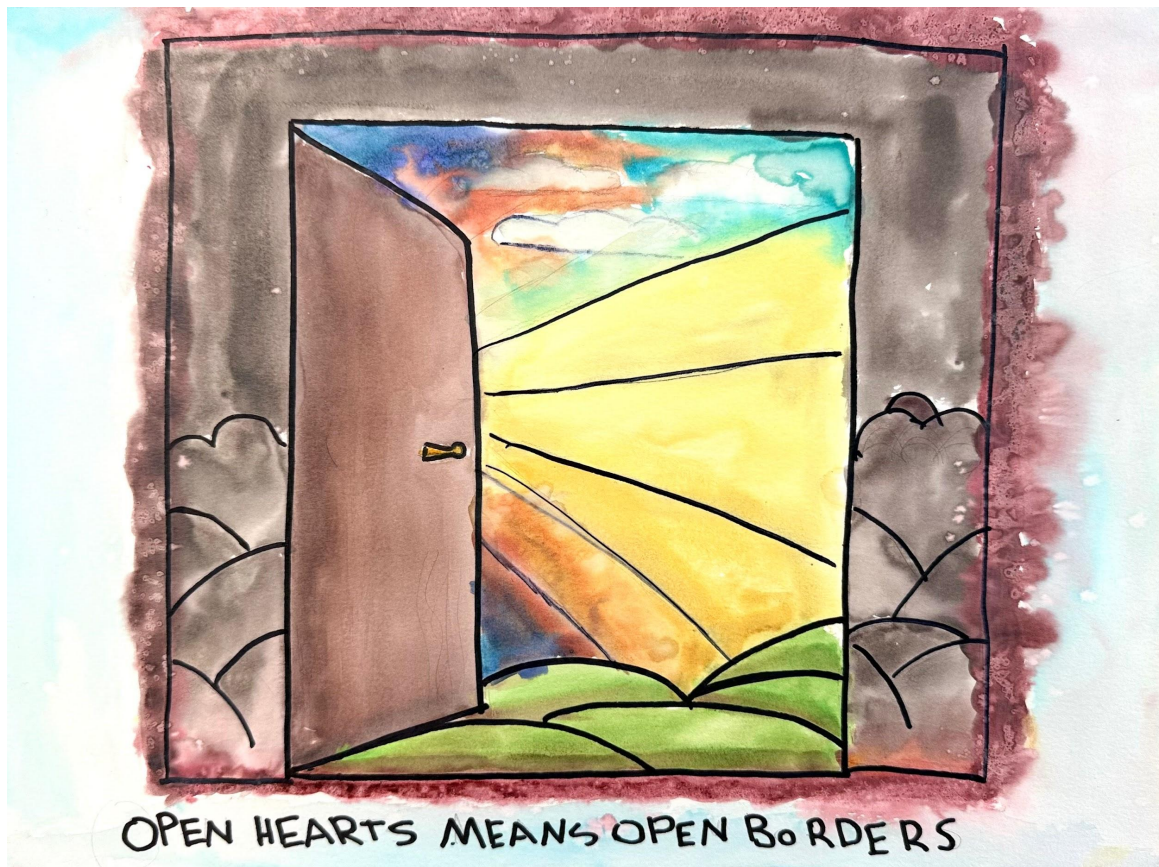
